

observation on Polaris. The distances were measured with 100-ft. and 500-ft. steel tapes.

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REPORT.

The lode line of each location of this claim was run directly upon the ground, and the several corners established by means of offsets from the lode lines. The shortest tie lines were run directly upon the ground, and the others computed from traverses consisting of said shortest tie lines and the boundary lines of this survey.

The corner to Secs. 12 and 13, T. 28 S., R. 63 E., and Secs. 7 and 18, T. 28 S., R. 64 E., M.D.M., is a granite stone 8x10x15 ins., chiseled with 6 notches on the West face and 2 notches on the North face. This is the nearest standing corner of the public survey that can be found and identified.

Sur. No. 3802, O.P.S. and Nellie Gray lodes;--

All of the corners are pine posts, properly set and scribed with the number of the corner and survey, and the initial letter or letters of the claim name. I find all courses and distances to be correct as approved.

NOTE;-- All discrepancies between these field notes and the several amended certificates of location are due to errors in the latter.
