Lode. Size 4 x 5 x 10 feet deep.

Value \$ 100.00

Each improvement is credited to the lode on which it is done except the main shaft, of which an undivided 1/4 is applied to each lode.

The general development of the claim through the main shaft will permit the extraction of the ore in the most economical manner with depth.

OTHER IMPROVEMENTS.

A Shaft House, the N.W. Cor. of which bears S.82° 30'E. 438.2 feet from Cor. No. 4, 1st W. Ex. of the Phonolite Lode. Size 10 x 10 feet. Course of side N.85° E.

Blacksmith shop, the N.W. cor. of which bears S.74° 31'E. 500.2 feet from Cor. No. 4, 1st W. Ex. of the Phonolite Lode. Size 10 x 12 feet. Course of long side N.65° 00'E. Both buildings are property of the claimant.

INSTRUMENT.

This survey was made with a Berger Mining Transit No. 5107. The courses were deflected from a true meridian determined by a direct solar observation. The distances were measured with a 660 ft. steel tape.

R E P O R T .

The S.W. Cor. of Sec. 31, T.11 N., R.37 E. M.D.M. is a granite rock 3 x 6 x 12 ins. above ground, set in a mound of stone, marked with six notches on each edge.

Cor. No. 3, Sur. No. 3106, Jockey Lode, is a 4 ins. square post, showing 3 feet above ground in mound of stone, scribed 3-3106.

The corners of the adjoining lodes, February, Tellurite, Criterion and Hazel S.,^A are hewn posts of cottonwood plainly marked with pencil and paint for the name of each claim and corner.
