and marked with 4 notches on S. and 5 notches on E. edges.

The E. 1/4 cor. Sec. 7, T. 24 N., R. 28 E. M.D.M. in a basalt stone, 14 x 10 by 8 ins. set in the ground with mound of stone, and marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  on W. face.

The N. 1/4 cor. Sec. 17, T. 24 N., R. 28 E. M.D.M. in a basalt stone, 14 x 11 x 7 ins. set in mound of stone, and marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  on N. face.

The W. 1/4 cor. Sec. 17, T. 24 N., R. 28 E. M.D.M. in a basalt stone, 15 x 8 by 4 ins. set in the ground with mound of stone, and marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  on W. face.

The N. 1/4 cor. and N.W. cor. of Sec. 18, T. 24 N., R. 28 E. of M.D.M. could not be found and identified by me when this line was run on October 7, 1911. On October 13, 1911 I returned to N.W. cor. of Sec. 18 and tried in the N.W. cor. of Sec. 18 at the given course and distance, it being a porphyry stone, 16 x 6 x 5 ins. set in mound of stone, and marked with 4 notches on S. and 2 notches on N. edges, it having been reestablished in the meantime by a party of surveyors engaged in the subdivision of T. 24 N. R. 27 E. of M.D.M.

Eureka No. 1 lode, unsurveyed.

The N.W. cor. is a rock monument, 2.5 ft. base, 4 ft. high, marked with paper placed between stones.

O. H. lode, unsurveyed.

Cor. No. 2, a box pine post, 4 x 6 ins. 4.5 ft. high, properly set and marked, N.W. cor. No. 2, O. H. lode.
