Instrument.

This survey was made with a C.L. Berger Mining Transit No. 3246. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by an observation on Polaris at eastern elongation. The distances were measured with 100-ft. and 660-ft. steel tapes.

Report.

The S.E. Cor. Sec. 35, T.5 S, R.38 E, M.D.M. is a black quartz rock, 5 X 12 X 13 ins., surrounded by a mound of stones, marked with one notch on the east and five notches on the west side, which is the nearest standing Cor. of the public land survey I could find.

The intersections with the west side line of Sec. 26, T.5 S, R.38 E, M.D.M. were calculated from the notes of the public land survey.
