

No. 7. The discovery shaft of the Lillian No. 3 lode, the N.E. Cor. of which bears S 7°20'W 45 ft. from the discovery point of the Lillian No. 3 lode, 4 X 6 X 10 ft. deep. Course N 30°W. Value \$100.

Other Improvements.

Instrument.

This survey was made with a C.L. Berger mining transit No. 3246. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by an observation on Polaris at eastern elongation. The distances were measured with 100-ft. and 660-ft. steel tapes.

Report.

The N.E. Cor. Sec. 20, T. 5 S, R. 39 E, M.D.M. is a porphyry stone 10 X 10 ins. showing 12 ins. above ground, with mound of stones surrounding, chiseled with 4 notches on the east side and 3 notches on the south side.

The intersections with the south line of section 20, T. 5 S, R. 39 E, M.D.M. were calculated from the notes of the public land survey. The S 1/4 Cor. Sec. 20 could not be found.
