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INSTRUMENT.

This survey was made with a Gurley light mountain transit, style No. 27. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observations. The distances were measured with 100-ft. and 500-ft. steel tapes.

REPORT.

The boundaries of each location of this claim were directly upon the ground. All tie lines were run directly upon the ground with the exception of the tie from Cor. No. 1, Lucky Chance Placer, to N. E. Cor. Sec. 1, T. 20 S., R. 62 E., M.D.M., which tie was determined by traverse, run upon the ground and submitted in a separate report herewith.

The N. E. Cor. of Sec. 1, T. 20 S., R. 62 E., M.D.M., is a limestone, 8×12 ins., showing 12 ins. above a mound of earth, and chiseled six notches N., W., and S. This is the nearest standing corner of the public survey that can be found and identified.

NOTE: The slight discrepancy between these field notes and the amended certificate of location of the Lucky Chance Placer, with regard to the tie from Cor. No. 1 thereof to N. E. Cor. Sec. 1, T. 20 S., R. 62 E., is due to an error in said amended certificate of location.

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
