

INSTRUMENT

This survey was made with a K & E light mountain transit No. 5050X. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined from an observation of Polaris. The distances were measured with a 300 ft. steel tape

REPORT

The lode line of this survey was run upon the ground and the several corners established by offsets from the lode line.

The tie line was run direct upon the ground
The NE Cor. of Sec. 24 T. 45 N. R. 63 E. M. D. M. is a quartz rock 8X8 ins. 12 ins. above ground with 3 grooves on the north face and 3 grooves on the south face

The $\frac{1}{4}$ Cor. on the north boundary of Sec. 24 T. 45 N. R. 63 E. M. D. M. is missing.

Cor. No. 4 Survey No. 1999 Empire lode is a lava rock 4X12 ins. 12 ins. above ground marked 4-1999
As the only Notary Public within 60 miles of this survey was one of my assistants it was necessary for me to take their affidavits.
