

SURVEY 4127.

LOUISE GYPSUM PLACER.

## REPORT.

The N.W. Cor. of Sec. 4, T.30 N., R.24 E. M.D.B & M. is properly marked and witnessed as reported in the field notes of survey of the West boundary of said section, by a stone 9 x 24 ins. set in a small mound of rocks.

I found no workings nor monuments of any kind upon this claim except the workings placed thereon by the claimant and his grantors.

Cor. No.1 Survey 3953, Red Mountain Placer, which is identical with Cor. No.1., this survey;- Cor. No.7 survey 3953, Red Mountain Placer, which is identical with Cor No.4, this survey;-Cor. No. 3 survey No. 3952 Black Mountain Placer, which is identical with Cor.No6 this survey;-- Cor. No.4, Survey No. 3952, Black Mountain Placer, which is identical with Cor. No. 7 this survey;--- and Cor. No1 survey No. 3952, which is identical with Cor. No.8, this survey, to all of which references are made in the above notes, are all in their proper places and are of the size and height, and bear their proper marks, as described in the above notes. I find lines 3-4 and 4-1, survey No. 3952, Black Mountain Placer to be correct as approved.

I found the line 5-6 Survey No. 3952, Esperanza Placer to be correct as approved. I found the tie from Cor. No. 1, survey No. 3953, Red Mountain Placer to Cor. No.4, Survey No. 3602, Selenite placer, Identical with Cor. No.5, survey No. 3951, Esperanza Placer, to be correct as approved.

There are no ledges or indications of mineral of any nature, except gypsum, upon the ground embraced in this claim.
