EXPENDITURE OF FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS

The latter shaft is located at a point from which the ground rises rapidly to the north-east and is of fairly uniform elevation to the south. By means of drifts to the north, east and south the veins of each of the locations will be cut at a considerable depth and one plant of machinery located at this point will most economically and advantageously develop this group.

OTHER IMPROVEMENTS

A cabin the south-east corner of which bears from Cor. No. 3, Eliza Jane lode, N. $6^{\circ}15'W$ 375 ft. 10 x 20 ft. frame. Course of long sides N. $60^{\circ}W$.

A frame blacksmith shop the south-east corner of which bears from Cor. No. 5, St. Cloud lode, N. $50^{\circ}10'W$. 321.8 ft. 10 x 10 ft. course of long sides N. $64^{\circ}W$.

A frame hoist house the south east corner of which bears from Cor. No. 5 St. Cloud lode N. $44^{\circ}07'W$. 298.6 ft. 12 x 15 ft. course of long sides N. $60^{\circ}W$.

INSTRUMENTS.

This survey was made with K. and E. transit No. 13390. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by a direct solar observation on line 3-4 Amazon lode as reported on separate sheet. Distances were measured with a 500 ft. and 100 ft steel tape

REPORT

The W. $\frac{1}{4}$ Cor. of Sec. 28, T. 2 N., R. 42 E. M.D.B.M. is a small stone 3 x 4 ins 10 ins. long chiseled on one side " $\frac{1}{4}S$ ", standing in a nest of small stones.

The N.W., N.E and S.E. Cors. of Sec. 28 T. 2 N., R. 42 E., M.D.B.M. are stones 10 x 12 ins.
