EXPENDITURE OF FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (Cont'd)

Whip, *Sky*. No. 3, and Iceberg No. 2 Lodes, Sur.No.4153, Limerick No. 2, Limerick, Salutation, Sky and Sky No.2 Lodes. All the above named Lodes are contiguous and the shaft and *crosscuts* form the most economical, and advantageous method of developing the claims as a group.

An equal and undivided one fifteenth interest of this improvement is to be applied to each lode.

The ground embraced in the Triplet and Golden Anchor Lodes has the least elevation, from which section the ground rises steadily to the North.

All that portion of the common improvement described, below the 840 ft. level has to my knowledge been performed subsequent to the location of the following Lodes. Bobtail, Whip, Sky No. 3, Iceberg, No.2, Limerick No.2, Limerick, Salutation, Sky and Sky No. 2.

 I N S T R U M E N T .

This survey was made with a C.L.Berger mining transit No. 3580.

The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observations. The distances were measured with 100 ft. and 500 ft. steel tapes.

 R E P O R T

The lode lines of each location of this claim was run directly upon the ground, and the several corners established by means of offsets from the lode lines. All tie lines were run directly upon the ground. The S.W.Cor.Sec.26, T.3 N., R.42 E., of M.D.B.& M. is a porphyry stone 4 x 6 inches, 12 inches above the general surface, marked with 2 notches on its East face and one notch on the South face.
