This survey was made with a Buff and Buff Light Mountain Transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observations. The distances were measured with 100 and 650 ft. steel tapes.

Report.

The S.W. Cor. Sec. 27 T.18 N., R.64 E., M.D. B. and M. is a 6 by 6 inch post standing 4 ft. out of ground. Post is painted white and marked Sec. 27, 28 on north and Sec. 33, 34 on south face. At base of ridge, east of McGill Tunnel. Along side of post is a lime rock showing 6 by 8 by 12 inches out of ground, chiseled 1 notch on south and 3 notches on east face.

This is the nearest corner of the Public Land Survey that could be found and identified.
