

REPORT.

The lode line of each location of this claim was run directly upon the ground (except that it was necessary to offset around the boarding houses on the lode line of the Argonaut lode), and the several corners verified by means of offsets from the lode lines. All tie lines were run either directly upon the ground or by traverses run upon the ground and submitted in a separate report herewith.

The E. $\frac{1}{4}$ Cor. Sec. 36, T. 20 S., R. 62 E., M.D.M., is a sandstone, 6x7x20 ins., set in a mound of rock, chiseled $\frac{1}{4}$ S on W. face.

The N. E. Cor. Sec. 1, T. 21 S., R. 62 E., M.D.M., is a limestone, 6x7x15 ins., set in a mound of rock, chiseled 6 notches W. and 6 notches S. These are the nearest standing corners of the public survey that can be found and identified.

NOTE: The slight differences between these field notes of survey and the several amended certificates of location, particularly with regard to the description of the discovery cuts, are due to errors in said amended certificates of location.
