of offsets from the lode lines
 The W. side line of the Iron Point lode
 was run direct upon the ground
 and the corners established by running
 the end lines direct upon the ground.
 The traverse from the Section corner
 to cor. Nos. 1, is submitted in a
 separate report herewith.

The tie lines between the Section
 and $\frac{1}{4}$ Section corners were run,
 as nearly as possible, direct upon
 the ground.

The N.E. cor. Sec. 4, T. 31 N., R. 42 E. of
 M.D.M. is a limestone, set in
 the ground, 6 x 8 ins. by 8 ins. above
 ground, and chiseled with 3 notches
 each, on E. and W. edges, and
 with a mound of stone, 2 ft. base,
 2.5 ft. high, alongside.

The E. $\frac{1}{4}$ cor. Sec. 4, T. 31 N., R. 42 E. of
 M.D.M., was not identified.
 A mound of earth and stone, but no
 markings, were found at the given
 point.

The S.E. cor. Sec. 4, T. 31 N., R. 42 E. of
 M.D.M. is a redwood post, 3.5 ft. high,
 set in mound of earth and stone,
 marked with 3 notches on E. edge,
 and 5 notches on S. edge, and
 scribed with Section number, and
 T. 31 N., R. 42 E.

The N. $\frac{1}{4}$ cor. Sec. 4, T. 31 N., R. 42 E.
 of M.D.M. is an iron post, 16 ins.
 high, set in the ground with mound
 of earth, stamped $\frac{1}{4}$ $\frac{33}{4}$, and with
 pits E. and W., and mound of earth
 3 base, 18 ins. high, alongside.

The E. $\frac{1}{4}$ cor. Sec. 33, T. 32 N., R. 42 E.
 of M.D.M. is an iron post, 16 ins.
 high, set in the ground with
 mound of earth and stone, stamped
