## INSTRUMENT.

This survey was made with a Berger Mining Transit No. 6. The courses were deflected from a true meridian determined by direct solar observation. The distances were measured with a 660 ft. steel tape.

## R E P O R T .

This survey is a separate and independent survey from the prior Sur. No. 3373 made by me in October 1907 and all distances and courses of that survey were checked and found correct as returned. The corners were in solid and had not been disturbed sufficient to throw the exact corner points off from the top at any corner.

## Description of Corners.

The W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  Cor. of Sec. 4, T.6 N., R.31 E. M.D.M. is a basalt rock 8 x 8 x 16 ins. above ground, with  $\frac{1}{4}$  chiseled on west face and mound of stone on the east.

Cor. No. 2, Sur. No. 3299, Gold Lode, is a 4 ins. square post showing 3 ft. above ground in mound of earth and stone, scribed 2-3299.

Note: The disagreement between these notes and the location certificate are due to errors in the latter. In relocating this ground the old corners were planed and marked in pencil.
