Foot.

Cor. Nos. 2--3 of the Long Shot, Cracker Jack and Red Oxide lodes respectively, are on a comparatively flat mesa that forms the summit of Black or Yerington Mt., which has a general Northwest and Southeast trend.

The S. E. Cor. Sec. 25 T. 13 N. R. 27 E., M. D. B. and M., is a granite stone, 6 x 8 ins. 6 ins. above ground, chiselled with 5 notches on the N. edge and 1 notch on the S. edge whence

A pine 9 ins. diam. bears N. 73° - W., 25.1 ft., blazed and scribed T. 13 N. R. 27 E. S. 25 B. T.

A pine 7 ins. diam bears S. 78° - E., 32.3 ft., blazed and scribed T. 13 N. R. 28 E., S. 31 B. T.

A fallen pine, 6 ins. diam., blazed and scribed T. 13 N. R. 28 E., S. 30 B. T., no stump remains to tie in.

A fallen pine, 10 ins. diam., blazed and scribed T. 13 N. R. 27 E., S. 36 B. T., no stump remains to tie in.

The E. $1/4$ Cor. Sec. 25 T. 13 N. R. 27 E., M. D. B. and M., is a granite stone, 6 x 6 ins., 6 ins. above ground, chiselled with $1/4$ on West face, alongside on the West is a small monument of rocks.

The E. $1/4$ Cor. Sec. 36 T. 13 N. R. 27 E., M. D. B. and M., is a granite stone 6 x 6 ins., 6 ins. above ground, chiselled with $1/4$ on West face whence

A pine, 12 ins. diam. bears due West 3.3 ft., blazed and scribed $1/4$ S. 36 B. T.

A pine, 13 ins. diam. bears N. 80° - E., 9.9 ft. blazed and scribed $1/4$ S. 31 B. T.
