The distances were measured with a 300 ft. steel
tape.

Description of Corners -

I find the Sw. Cor. Sec. 34, T. 46. N. R. 58. E. of the
M. D. Band M. to be a granitic rock, 10x6x6 ins.
above ground, firmly set, and marked with 3 grooves
on E and W. faces, and S. C. on N. face - with
mound of stones on N. side thereof.
I find Cor. No. 2 of Sur. No. 4005, Dutch Flat
Lode, to be a hewed aspen post, 5x4 ins, showing
2.5 ft. above ground, firmly set in earth and
mound of stones and scribbled D. F. 2-4005.
I find Cor. No. 1, Sur. No. 4005, Dutch Flat Lode, Cor.
No. 2, Sur. No. 4004, Nordeman Lode, and Cor.
No. 4, Sur. No. 3963, Kaiser Lode, to be one and
the same post for all three corners, and
which is a hewed aspen post, 4 ins. square, showing
2 ft. above ground, firmly set in mound of
stones, and scribbled K. 4-3963 on E. face,
N. 2-4004 on N. face and D. F. 1-4005 on
W. face.

List of Errors

The disagreements between these field notes and
the location certificate with regard to the claim
not extending southerly from South end line of
the Taft lode and the distances claimed
along the vein northerly and southerly from
the discovery, are due to errors in said cer-
tificate.
