INSTRUMENT.

This survey was made with a Buff and Berger transit No. 2438. The courses were deflected from the true Meridian as determined by direct solar observations.

The distances were measured with 100 and 500 ft. steel tapes.

REPORT.

The lode lines of each location of this claim were run direct upon the ground and the several corners established by means of offsetts from the lode lines. All the lines were run direct upon the ground.

The S.E. Cor. Sec. 20 T.22 N., R.23E., M.D.B. and M. is an andesite rock 20 x 6 x 6 ins.; 5 ins. above the surface of the ground; marked II on the South and IIII on the East edges, with mound of rock 2 ft. base; 1½ ft. high, West of corner, whence a cedar tree 10 ins. in diameter bears N.85°50'W.-77.85 ft.; marked T.22 R23 S20 BT. A cedar tree 6 ins. in diameter, bears S.82°45'W.-85.8 ft.; marked T22N R23E S29BT. A cedar tree 8 ins. in diameter bears S. 49°15'E.-172.1 ft.; marked T22N R23E S28BT.
