Improvement No. 17 is in the course of construction for the development of this claim. The shaft which constitutes the main working shaft, with other proposed workings will be used as a means of developing the veins of all the lodes constituting this claim. The crosscuts on the 100 ft. level will be extended, and after sinking has been resumed additional crosscuts will be commenced at greater depths and eventually extended in general easterly and westerly directions, respectively, in such a way as to thoroughly explore and develop all the ground lying within the lines of this claim. As this surface ground is practically level the above system of workings will afford a general development scheme at uniform depths throughout this claim.

An undivided one fifth interest in this improvement is credited to each location of this claim.

Instrument.

This survey was made with a Berger transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observations. Distances were measured with 100 ft. and 500 ft. steel tapes.

N. W. Cor. Sec. 34, T 3 N., R 42 E., M.D.B. and M, is a stone, 6X6 ins., 10 ins. above ground, marked with 1 notch on the south and 3 notches on the east faces respectively.
