Instrument.

This survey was made with a C.L. Berger Light Mountain transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observations. The distances were measured with a 500 ft. and 50 ft. steel tapes.

Report.

The S.E. Cor. Sec. 1 T. 7 S. R. 41 E. is a basalt rock showing .6 x .8 x .6 ft. above ground in a ring of rock, chiseled x on top and l on North and lllll on South. Cor. Nos 3-1 Surs Nos. 3535 and 3845 Lime Point No. 5 and Hillside No. 3 lodes respectively is a 4 x 4 post showing 2 ft. above ground in a mound of earth and rock, scribed 3-3535 and H.3 1-3845.

Cor. Nos 4-1, Surs. Nos. 3845 and 4265 Hillside No. 3 and Hillside Extension lodes respectively is a pine post 4x4 inches scribed H.3-4.3845 and H.E.1-4265 showing 2 ft above the ground in mound of earth and rock.

Cor No. 4 Sur. No 3967 Grand Central No. 3 Lode. is a pine post 4 x 4 inches showing 2 ft above the ground in a mound of earth and rock scribed 4-3967. I find line 3-4 of said Survey No 3967 to be N. 33° 09' E. instead of N 33° 14' E. as reported to me from your office.
