The whole of these workings are located within the lines of lode claims belonging to claimant herein. They are in the course of construction for the development of said lode claims, underground work being prosecuted vigorously at the present time. On the 400 ft. Level the crosscut mentioned above is being extended in its present course in order that it may encounter and develop the veins existing on the Keystone Lode. Instrument.

This survey was made with a Berger transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observations. Distances were measured with 100 ft. and 500 ft. steel tapes.

N. E. Cor. Sec. 34, T 3 N., R 42 E., M.D.R. and M, is a porphyry stone, standing 10 ins. above mound of stone, marked with one notch on the south, and two notches on the east faces, respectively.

Cors. No. 1, Sur. No. 2170, Cash Boy Lode, and Sur. No. 2177, Golden Anchor Lode, respectively, is a pine post 4 ins. square, standing 3 ft. above mound of earth, scribed, 1-2170, 1-2177.
