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INSTRUMENT.

This survey was made with a C. L. Berger & Sons No. 4 transit. The courses were deflected from a meridian established in connection with my Sur. No. 3340. The distances were measured with a Lufkin 660 ft. steel tape.

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REPORT.

The N. E. Cor. Sec. 24, T. 14 N., R. 37 E., M. D. B. and M., is a stone 4 x 9 ins. showing 13 ins. above ground, marked with 3 notches on its north edge and 3 notches on its south edge. The tie to this corner was made after a diligent but unsuccessful search for corners closer to the claim.

Cor. No. 3 Amethyst Extension lode Sur No. 3340 is a stone 8 x 10 ins. showing 8 ins. above ground chiseled
