No. 8. The discovery cut Lucky Tiger lode the face of which from Cor. No. 2 bears N. 6° 30' W. 505 ft., 7 ft. face, 5 ft. wide running N. 10° W. 15 ft.,

Value \$50.00

No. 9. The discovery shaft Annex Extension lode which from Cor. No. 1 bears S. 43° 40' W. 453 ft., 4 x 10 ft. x 6 ft. deep.

Value \$50.00

The surface ground of this claim rises rapidly in northerly, easterly and southerly directions from the mouth of the discovery tunnel Sooy lode improvement No. 1. By extending this tunnel in its present direction and by driving drifts in northerly and southerly directions from proper points within the tunnel the entire claim will be developed in the most economical and miner-like manner available. Such being the intention of the claimant an undivided one-seventh interest in this improvement, value \$1535.71, is therefore credited to each lode location of this claim.

INSTRUMENT.

This survey was made with a C. L. Berger & Sons No. 4 transit. The courses were deflected from a meridian established in connection with my Survey No. 3340. The distances were measured with a Lufkin 660 ft. steel tape.

REPORT.

The N. E. Cor. Sec. 24, T. 14 N., R. 37 E., M. D. M., is a stone 4 x 9 ins. showing 13 ins. above ground, marked with 3 notches on its north edge and 3 notches on its south edge. This is the nearest standing corner of the public surveys that can be found and identified.
