

Queen No. 1 lode, N 55° 50' W., 505.0 ft., 5 ft. wide, 4 ft. deep, running N 10° W., 98 ft. to northerly end.

Cut, southerly end of which bears from Cor. No. 3,

Silver Queen No. 1 lode, N 53° 35' W., 555.0 ft., 5 ft. wide, 3 ft. deep, running N 5° W., 55 ft. to northerly end.

Cut, easterly end of which bears from Cor. No. 3, Silver

Queen No. 2 lode, N 3° 05' E., 287.0 ft., 4 ft. wide, 3 ft. deep, running S 60° E., 100 ft. to easterly end.

Cut, westerly end of which bears from Cor. No. 3, Silver

Queen No. 2 lode, N 8° 05' E., 305.0 ft., 6 ft. wide, 6 ft. deep, running S 50° E., 30 ft. to easterly end.

Cut, easterly end of which bears from Cor. No. 1, Silver

Queen lode, N 2° 00' E., 177.0 ft., 5 ft. wide, 3 ft. deep, running N 80° W., 100 ft. to westerly end.

Cut, southerly end of which bears from Cor. No. 1, Silver

Queen lode, S 85° 15' W., 30.0 ft., 5 ft. wide, 5 ft. deep, running N 10° W., 45 ft. to northerly end.

Cut, northerly end of which bears from Cor. No. 1, Silver

Queen lode, N 72° 15' W., 88.0 ft., 5 ft. wide, 9 ft. deep, running N 85° W., 15 ft. to westerly end.

Instrument.

This survey was made with a Berger transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian, as determined from direct solar observations. Distances were measured with 100 ft. and 500 ft. steel tapes.

Note:- The disagreements between these field notes and the amended location certificates of the lodes in this claim are due to errors in the latter.

Report.

The N. W. Cor. Sec. 33, T 3 N., R 42 E., M. D. B. and M, is a porphyry stone, 2X6 ins. 10 inches above ground, marked with 4 notches on the east, and 1 notch on the south faces, respectively.
