

## Survey No. 4325

## INSTRUMENT

This survey was made with a Wm. Ainsworth and Sons Theodolite No. 2951, the courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observation.

The distances were measured with 100ft. and 500ft. steel tapes.

## REPORT

The lode line of this claim was run directly upon the ground and the several corners established by means of offsets from the lode line.

The tie was run directly to the section cor., which is in sight of cor. no. 1 and is the nearest corner of the public survey.

The S.W. Cor. of Sec. 20, T. 21 N., R. 23 E., M.D.M. is an Andesite stone 5"x 10" at the top, set in the ground marked with 5 notches on the east and 2 notches on the south. Near it are three bearing trees blazed and scribed respectively

T. 21 N., R. 23 E. Sec. 29 B.T.

The corners of this survey are identical with the amended location as staked on the ground.
