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R E P O R T .

The S.W. Cor. of Sec. 31, T. 11 N., R. 37 E. M.D.M.  
is a granite rock 3 x 6 x 12 ins. above ground, set in a  
mound of earth and stone, marked with six notches on each  
edge.

U.S. Mineral Monument No. 244 is a large Quartz rock  
4x6x4 feet high, in place. It forms part of a rugged  
outcrop which caps a small round butte lying about three  
quarters of a mile west of the old camp of Goldyke. The  
Mineral Monument is chiseled with a cross (x) on top to  
indicate the exact point and U.S.M.M. No. 244 on the N.W.  
face. A mound of stone 4 feet high by 4 feet at the  
base stands on a part of the same outcrop, 4 feet from  
the cross (x).

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
