This survey was made with a Buff and Buff Light Mountain Transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observation. The distances were measured with 100 ft. and 650 ft. steel

## Report.

The corner to Secs. 1, 2, 11 and 12, T. 35 N. R. 50 E. (Unapproved) Mt. D. B. and M. is a 2 inch pipe, extending 1 ft. above ground stamped, S. 2, S. 1, S. 11, S. 12, T. 35 N. R. 50 E. Mound of stone along side. U.S.M.M. No. 292 is a Rhyolite Stone, 6 by 18 inches extending 2 ft. out of mound of stone, marked U.S.M.M. No. 292 on south face, mound of stone surrounding same 4 ft. in diameter and 2 ft. high. A mound of stone 6 ft. in diameter and 4 ft. high is situated 6 ft. west of monument, on crest of ridge.

Cor. No. 4 Sur. No. 4332 Big Six No. 3 Lode is a 10 by 12 inch Rhyolite Stone 12 inches out of ground chistled B-S-3-4-4332.

Cor. common to Compromise 10 and 11 lodes is a 4 by 4 inch sawed pine post, extending  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ft. above mound of stone.

N.W. Cor. Compromise No. 11 Lode is a 4 by 4 inch sawed pine post, extending  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ft. above mound of stone.

N.E. Cor. Compromise No. 10 Lode is a mound of stone.

S.E. Cor. Compromise No. 11 and S.W. Compromise No. 10 is a mound of stone. All corners marked properly.

Note: The disagreement between these field notes and the location certificate, with regards to the position of the discovery point is due to errors in the latter.
