Other improvements.

A frame engine house, the Northwest corner of which bears from Cor. No. 4, Grey Rock No. 1 lode, S.46°15'E., 338 ft., 20 x 28 ft., course of long sides S.27°W.

A frame blacksmith shop, the Northeast corner of which bears from Cor. No. 4, Grey Rock No. 1 lode, S.37°32'E., 420 ft., 12 x 16 ft. Course of long sides S.14°W.

A frame house, the Northwest corner of which bears from Cor. No. 4, Grey Rock No. 1 lode, S.12°22'30"E., 473 ft., 14½ x 14½ ft. Course of long sides N.8°W.

A frame house, the Northeast corner of which bears from Cor. No. 4, Grey Rock No. 1 lode, S.24°50'E., 267 ft., 16 x 24 ft. Course of long sides S.31°W.

The above described improvements all belong to the claimant herein.

This survey was made with a C. L. Berger & Sons transit No. 4017. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observations. The distances were measured with 100-ft. and 300-ft. steel tapes.

Report.

The Cor. of Secs. 2, 3, 34 and 35, Tps. 1 and 2 N., R. 42 E., M. D. M., to which connection is herein given, is a stone, showing 5 x 9 x 14 ins. above the ground in mound of stone, marked with 2 notches on East and 4 notches on West edges and a cross (X) on top.
