

EXPENDITURE OF FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS-continued.

No.2 Trench, south end of which bears from Discovery Monument, Bank lode, N.84°20'W., 190 ft., 4 ft. wide, 5 ft. deep, running N.42°W., 35 ft., to northerly end.

Value \$150.00

No.3 Trench, east end of which bears from Discovery Monument, Bank lode, N.66°W., 270 ft., 4 ft. wide, 3 ft. deep, running N.40°W., 25 ft. to northerly end.

Value \$100.00

All of the above improvements belong to claimant herein.

INSTRUMENT.

This survey was made with a A.Lietz transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined from direct solar observations. The distances were measured with 100 ft. and 650 ft. steel tapes.

REPORT.

The $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. Cor. between Secs. 34, T. 3 N., R. 42 E., M.D.B. and M., and Sec. 3, T. 2 N., R.42 E., M.D.B and M., is a granite stone 18x6x5 inches, marked with $\frac{1}{4}$ on its North face, and is the nearest corner to the respective Cors. No.I., of the various lodes of this claim, that could be found and identified.

All corners of Sur. No. 4089, Wonder lode, and Seventy Six Fraction lode; Sur. No.2669; "76" lode, Sur. No. 2484, Panther and New Jersey lodes, are posts, properly scribed with their respective corner and survey number.

Intersections with section lines, were made in accordance with the approved field notes of T. 2 and 3 N., R. 42 E., M.D.B and M.
