A frame and corrugated iron bunk house, the N.E. Cor. of which bears from the discovery monument Bazaar No. 2 lode, S. 7° 29' W. 168.3 ft. 16x16 ft. Course one side N. 89° 30' W. Claimant herein.

A frame and corrugated iron bunk house, the N.E. Cor. of which bears from the Discovery monument, Bazaar No. 2 lode, S. 18° 03' W. 174.4 ft. 16x24 ft. Course long side N. 89° 30' W. Claimant herein.

A frame cabin, the N.E. Cor. of which bears from Cor. No. 5, Bazaar No. 3 lode, S. 9° 56' W. 290.1 ft. 10x12 ft. Course long side N. 33° W. Claimant herein.

A frame cabin, the N.E. Cor. of which bears from Cor. No. 5, Bazaar No. 3 lode, S. 45° 15' W. 140.8 ft. 12x12 ft. Course one side N. 72° E. Claimant herein.

 INSTRUMENT.

This survey was made with an Ainsworth Light Mountain Theodolite Transit. The courses were deflected from true meridian as determined by a direct solar observation. The distances were measured with 100 ft. and 650 ft. steel tapes.

 REPORT.

The lode line of each location of this claim was run directly upon the ground and the several corners established by means of off-sets from the lode lines. The Section tie line from Cor. No. 1, Bazaar lode, was run directly upon the ground and the other Section tie lines were figured thru the lines of this survey. All other tie lines were run directly upon the ground.

The S.W. Cor. Section 35, T. 2 N., R. 42 E., M.D.M., is a stone set in small mound of earth and stone, chiseled 2 notches on the East and 6 notches on the North.

Survey No. 4409, Close, Close Fraction, Toggery No. 2 and June lodes:-

All corners mentioned herein are pine posts, 4 ins. square, properly set and scribed as approved, with the exception of Cor. No. 6, Sur. No. 4409, June lode, which corner is a stone set in the ground, with mound of stone alongside, and chiseled as approved.
