

Other Improvements-- continued.

Blacksmith shop, S.E. Cor. of which bears from discovery monument, Annex No. I, lode, N. 76° W. 320 ft., 12x26 ft. Course of long sides N. 20° E.

Bunk house, S.W. Cor. of which bears from discovery monument, Annex No. I, lode, N. $24^{\circ}45'$ W. 260 ft., 27x107 ft. Course of long sides N. 54° W.

Boarding house, S.W. Cor. of which bears from discovery monument, Annex No. I, lode, N. 12° E., 148 ft., 26x76 ft. Course of long sides N. 52° W.

Office and residence, S.W. Cor. of which bears from discovery monument, Annex No. I, lode, N. $48^{\circ}45'$ E., 106 ft., 24x28 ft. Course of long sides N. 64° W.

All of the foregoing improvement belong to claimants herein.

This survey was made with a A. Lietz transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined from direct solar observations. The distances were measured with 100 ft. and 650 ft. steel tapes.

Report.

The S.W. Cor. Sec. 35, T.21 S., R. 63 E., M.D.B and M., is a basalt stone 10x7 ins., showing 4 ins., above a mound of earth and stone, marked with 4 notches on W, and 2 notches on E, edges respectively. This is the nearest standing corner of the public survey that can be found and identified. No other corners to section 35, can be found.

All corners mentioned herein are pine posts, $4\frac{1}{2}$ ft. long, 4" square, properly set and marked with a description of the corner.
