

The surface embraced in this claim ascends on a gradual slope from the westerly end line in the direction of the lode line toward the easterly end line, the latter line being about 100 ft. higher.

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INSTRUMENTS

This survey was made with a Lietz No.5 transit, the courses were deflected from the true Meridian as determined by direct solar observations. The distances were measured with 100 ft. and 660 ft. Lufkin steel tapes.

NOTE: The disagreements between these field notes and the location certificate of the West Tonopah Fraction lode with regard to the position of the discovery monument and the courses and distances of the boundary lines, are due to error in the latter.

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REPORT

All of the lines of the West Tonopah Fraction lode, and the tie to the 1/4 Sec. Cor. on the north bdry. Sec. 2, T. 2 N., R. 42 E.M.D.B. & N. were made direct upon the ground, this 1/4 Sec. Cor. is a granite stone 18 x 6 x 5 ins. with mound of stone alongside. This corner agrees with its location, as determined from the official record of Sur. No. 2107, Utah lode.

Cors. Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4 Sur. No. 2107 Utah lode, are pine posts, showing 2-1 2 ft. above the ground, scribed 1-2107, 2-2107, 3-2107 and 4-2107, respectively.

The N.E. and S.E. Cors. Pup No. 3 lode, unsurveyed, and the N.W., N.E. and S.E. Cors. Pup No. 1, unsurveyed,
