No.4 An open cut 5 ft. wide running N.2°58'E. 20.5 ft. to 10 ft. face, in solid rock. Mouth of cut bears S.17°22'E 26.0 ft. from discovery monument of the Solitaire Lode.

Value of open cut. \$100.00

Improvement No.1 is the main working tunnel of the property. The ground rises rapidly to the south from Improvement No.1. The extension of this tunnel upon its present course will cut the veins of this claim at considerable depth, whereby one system of workings and one plant of machinery, the entire claim is most advantageously and economically developed.

An undivided 1/2 interest in Improvement No.1. is accredited to each of the lodes of this claim.

Instrument.

This survey was made with a Buff and Buff Light Mountain Transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observation. The distances were measured with 100 ft. and 500 ft. steel tapes.

Report.

The N. 1/4 Cor. of Sec.32 T.3 S.R. 59 E. Mt.D.B. and M. is a quartzite rock, 9 by 15 inches, extending 8 inches out of ground, marked 1/4 on North face. Mound of stone 2 ft. N.W. of corner.

Cor. No.3 is a hewed post, 4 by 4 inches, extending 2 1/2 ft. above a mound of stone, and properly scribed.
