Collar of shaft bears S.88°51'E. 440.0 ft. from Cor. No.3 Red Top Lode.

Value of shaft and drift. \$5,000

The surface embraced in this claim extends rapidly from Improvements Nos.37 and 38 in an easterly, northerly, and westerly direction; said improvements being situated in a small flat at the junction of the two main draws cutting the claims. By extending the development in Improvements Nos. 37 and 38, each of the veins of the several lode locations embraced in this claim can be developed at depth, where by one system of workings and one plant of machinery, the entire claim can be most advantageously and economically developed.

An undivided 1/14 interest in Improvements Nos.37 and 38 are applied to each of the lodes of this claim. All other improvements are accredited to their respective locations upon which they are located.

Instrument.

This survey was made with a Buff and Buff Light Mountain Transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined from direct solar observations.

The distances were measured with 100 ft. and 650 ft. steel tapes.

Report.

The E. 1/4 Cor. Sec.5, T.4 S., R.59 E. Mt.D.B.&M is a blue lime stone rock, 6 inches by 6 inches by 24 inches, well set in a mound of stone, said stone is chiseled 1/2 on west face.
