INSTRUMENT

This survey was made with a Lietz Company transit.

The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observations. The distances were measured with 100ft. and 500ft. steel tapes.

REPORT

All lines and ties of this survey were run direct or by traverse upon the ground.

The NW Cor. Sec. 18, T. 28 N. R. 34 E. M. D. B. & M. is a stone, 8 x 12 ins. showing 12 ins. above ground, chiseled with 4 notches on the south and 2 notches on the north.
