

The corner to Secs. 4, 5, 8 and 9, T. 30 N., R. 53 E., M. D. M., is a rhyolite rock 7 x 9 ins., 8 ins. out of ground, with mound of stone alongside, chiseled with 4 notches on the East face and 5 notches on the South face. This is the nearest standing corner of the public survey that can be found and identified.

Sur. No. 3382, Androsa lode:-

Cor. No. 2 is a pine post, properly set, scribed A-2-3382. I find Cor. No. 2 to be N. 14° 10' E., 1089.4 ft. from Cor. No. 1, Grey Eagle lode, this survey.

Sur. Lots No. 37, A and B, William S. Lee mine and mill site:-

Diligent search and inquiry of the oldest known inhabitant failed to reveal the location of any of the corners of this survey.

Lucky May lode, unsurveyed:-

Cor. No. 3 is a rhyolite rock, properly set, chiseled (X), IM-3. I find line 2-3 to be N. 59° 06' W., 600 ft.

Lucky May and Lucky May No. 1 lodes, both unsurveyed:-

Cor. No. 2, 3, respectively, is a limestone rock properly set, chiseled (X), IM-2, IM1-3.

Lucky May No. 1 lode, unsurveyed:-

Cor. No. 1 and Cor. No. 2 are limestone rocks, properly set, chiseled respectively, (X) IM1-1 and (X), IM1-2. I find line 2-3 to be N. 59° 06' W., 600 ft., and the course of line 1-2 to be S. 30° 21' W.

Lucky May No. 2 and Minnie E lodes, both unsurveyed:-

Cor. No. 1, 1, respectively, is a limestone rock properly set, chiseled (X) IM2-1, ME-1. Cor. No. 2, 2, respectively, is a limestone rock properly set, chiseled (X), IM2-2, ME-2, EI-1, HM-1. I find the course of lines 1-2, 1-2, respectively, to be S. 34° 24' E.

Minnie E lode, unsurveyed:-

Cor. No. 3 is a limestone ledge, 30 x 50 ft., 10 ft. above ground, with mound of rocks superimposed near the corner point, chiseled (X), ME-3, EI-4. Cor. No. 4 is a
