

SURVEY NO. 4606.

INSTRUMENT.

This survey was made with a C. L. Berger & Sons, mining transit, the courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observations.

The distances were measured with a 600 ft. steel tape.

REPORT.

The lines of this survey were run upon the ground.

The SW. Corner, Sec. 32, T. 21 N., R., 69 E., Mt. Diablo B. and M., is an iron pipe, 3 ins. in diameter, 1 ft. above ground, with cap, marked, S-31, S-32, T. 21 N., R. 69 E., S. C. -- 1913.

with pits one foot deep East and West of corner.

This is the nearest standing corner of the public land survey that could be found and identified.

Note; Any discrepancy between these field notes and the amended location certificate is due to errors in the latter.
