

were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observations. Distances were measured with 100 ft. and 500 ft. steel tapes.

Note:- The disagreements between these field notes and the location certificates of this claim are due to errors in the latter.

Report.

After making a diligent search I was unable to find the 1/4 Sec. Cor. on the east boundary of Sec. 28, T 3 N., R 42 E., M.D.B and M.

The S. E. Cor. Sec. 28, T 3 N., R 42 E., M.D.B and M, is a stone, 6X6 ins., 10 ins. above ground, chiselled with one notch on the south and three notches on the east faces, respectively.

All corners of Sur. No. 2782, Stella et al lodes are posts, properly scribed with their respective corner and survey number.

S. W. Cor. Ruth No. 3 and the N. W. Cor. Ruth No. 4 lodes both unsurveyed, is a post marked S. W. Cor. Ruth No. 3 lode and N. W. Cor. Ruth No. 4 lode.

All corners of unsurveyed lode claims reported in Sur. No. 2782, Stella et al lodes have been destroyed.
