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INSTRUMENT.

This survey was made with a C.L.Berger Mining Transit No.5107. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observation. The distances were measured with a 600 ft. steel tape.

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REPORT.

The N $\frac{1}{4}$  Cor.Sec.21,T 8 N., R 32 E., M.D.M. is a limestone rock, 6 x 6 x 3 ins. marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  on north side; surrounded by a mound of rock 2 ft. in diameter.
