

SURVEY NO. 4651.

REPORT.

The location of this claim was determined by running the lines of the claims and by traverse lines run upon the ground. The several corners established by means of offsets from the lode lines. All the lines were either run directly upon the ground or by traverses run upon the ground.

Cor. No. 3 Sur. No. 4650 Broken Hills Special Lode is pine post 4 ins. square, standing $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. above mound of earth and stone, scribed 3-4650 B.H.S.

Cor. No. 1 Sur. No. 4650 Broken Hills Special No. 2 Lode is a pine post 4 ins. square, standing $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. above mound of earth and stone, scribed 1-4650 B.H.S.#2.

Cor. No. 2 Sur. No. 4630 Calico No. 2 Lode is a pine post 4 ins. square, standing $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. above mound of earth and stone, scribed 2-2-4630 C.No.1. C.No.2.

The S.W.Cor. T.14 N. R.36 E. M. D. B. & M. is a stone $4\frac{1}{2}$ X 4 inches, 9 inches long, with 6 notches on all four edges.

This survey was made with a C.L. Berger & Sons No. 4 Light Mountain Transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observations. The distances were measured with a 6 ft. and 300 ft. steel tapes.

Note:—The discrepancies between these field notes and the location and amended location certificates of the several lode claims entered in this survey are due to errors in the latter.
