

run either directly upon the ground, or by traverses run upon the ground.

The North $\frac{1}{4}$ Corner of Sec. 27, T. 39 N., R. 46 E., M.D.M., is a porphyry rock, 6x8 ins., 9 ins. above ground with mound of stone, chiseled $\frac{1}{4}$ on the north face. This is the nearest standing corner of the public survey that can be found and identified.

Sur. No. 4356, Hardscrabble No. 2 lode:-

Cor. No. 3 is a pine post, 4 ins. square, properly set and scribed H. No. 2-3-4356.

I find Cor. No. 3 to be S. $21^{\circ}02'$ W., 4827.14 ft. from the N. $\frac{1}{4}$ Cor. of Sec. 27, T. 39 N., R. 46 E., M.D.M., instead of Cor. No. 1, S. $49^{\circ}23'30''$ E., 6837 ft. from the S.W. Cor. of Sec. 21, T. 39 N., R. 46 E., M.D.M., as approved.

Sleeping Beauty, Poor Man, Pan Handle, Orphan Boy, Pan Handle No. 2, Orphan Boy No. 2 and Red Top lodes:-

The differences between the ties to the $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. Cor. as given in these notes and those given in the amended location certificates is due to errors in the latter.

NE $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$, Sec. 27, T. 39 N., R. 46 E., M.D.M.:-

After diligent search I was unable to find or identify corners on the West line or the East or South $\frac{1}{4}$ Corners of Sec. 27, T. 39 N., R. 46 E., M.D.M.

The subdivision of the section is therefore treated descriptively. I find the north line of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$ to run S. $89^{\circ}55'$ W., 1323.3 ft. from the North $\frac{1}{4}$ Corner of said section, the west line of said subdivision to run south 1320 ft., and the south line to run N. $89^{\circ}54'$ E.
