INSTRUMENT.

This survey was made with a Buff & Buff Model 25 tran-  
sit, No. 10482. The courses were deflected from the  
true meridian as determined by direct solar observations.  
The distances were measured with 500-ft. and 5-ft. steel  
tapes.

#### REPORT.

The boundary lines of the location of this claim were  
run upon the ground. The tie line to the  $\frac{1}{4}$  section  
corner was by traverse, run upon the ground. All other  
tie lines were run directly upon the ground.

The North  $\frac{1}{4}$  Corner of Sec. 27, T. 39 N., R. 46 E.,  
M. D. M., is a porphyry rock, 6x8 ins., 9 ins. above  
ground, with mound of stone chiseled  $\frac{1}{4}$  on the north face.  
This is the nearest standing corner of the public land  
surveys that can be found and identified.

Sur. No. 4666, Orphan Boy lode:-

Cor. No. 2 is a rhyolite rock 8x12 ins., 12 ins.  
above ground, with mound of stone alongside, chiseled  
(x) OB-2-4666.

Gold Circle Run No. 1 lode, unsurveyed:-

S.E. and N.W. Corners are pine posts properly set  
and stenciled with the name of the lode and corner.

I find south line to run N. 76° 30' E., from S.W.  
corner.

Gold Circle Run No. 3 lode, unsurveyed:-

set and stenciled with the name of the lode and corner.
