No. 4 A trench the south end of which bears from Cor. No. 3, S. 50°25' W. 424 ft. 5 ft. wide, 3 ft. deep extends N. 70°W. 25 ft.

No. 5 A cut the mouth of which bears from Cor. No. 6 N. 56°15' E. 183 ft. 5 ft. wide runs S. 45°E. 18 ft. to a 9 ft. face, at face of cut a tunnel 4½ x 7 ft. runs S. 45°E. 30 ft. to point 1. Thence S. 17°W. 51 ft. to face and S. 45°E. 354 ft. to point 2. Thence N. 70°E. 44 ft. to face, and S. 40°E. 141 ft. to point 3. Thence S. 50°W. 35 ft. to face, all in mineralized dacite
Value of cut and tunnel \$8600.00

No. 6 A cut the mouth of which bears from Cor. No. 6 N. 88°31' E. 281 ft. 5 ft. wide runs S. 45°E. 18 ft. to a 9 ft. face.

This survey was made with a C.L. Berger & Sons No. 2 transit
The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observations and distances were measured with one hundred and five hundred foot steel tapes .
