

## SURVEY NO. 4765.

No. 1. The discovery shaft of the Barum #4 Lode, the center of which bears S.  $74^{\circ}20'W.$ , 261.0 ft. from Cor. No. 1, Barum #4 Lode, 6 x 6 ft. 10 ft. deep. Value \$70.00.

No. 1. The discovery cut of the Barum #5 Lode, the mouth of which bears N.  $63^{\circ}W.$ , 382 ft. from Cor. No. 1, Barum #5 Lode. 6 ft. wide, runs S.  $45^{\circ}W.$ , 18 ft. to a 12 ft. face. Value \$45.00.

A statement of the balance of the value of the labor and improvements upon this claim will be furnished later.

#### OTHER IMPROVEMENTS.

A road which enters the claim near Cor. No. 1, Barum #5 lode, and runs N.W. for about 100 ft.

A road which enters the claim near the east side center of Barum #1 lode, and extends for about 800 ft. on Barum #1 lode.

A road which cuts across the S.E. corner of Barum #4 lode, for about 270 ft. and runs N.E. and S.W.

A road which enters on line 2-3, Barum #4 lode, and curves northerly and then southwesterly, and leaves the claim on line 3-4, Barum #4 lode.

#### REPORT.

The lode line of each location of this claim was run directly upon the ground, and the several corners established by means of offsets from the lode lines. All tie lines were run directly upon the ground.

The discovery monuments of each lode location as found upon the ground was a pine post, 4 ins. square, 3 ft. above the surface, firmly set in a mound of earth and stone, properly marked for the location.

The  $1/4$  Sec. Cor. between Secs. 7 and 12, T. 37 N., Rgs. 41 and 42 E., is an old juniper post, cut at the ends, 4- $1/2$  ft. long, and 3 ins. in diameter at the
