42.86 ft. to Pt. "D", on line 1-2 of the Tungsten No. 24 lode, from which Cor. No. 2 of the Tungsten No. 24 lode, bears N. 0°01' E., 24.08 ft., thence N. 26°30' E., 26.91 ft. to Pt. "A" and place of beginning. 2,800 cubic yards material removed.

The improvements are in progress for the development of the twenty-seven lodes of this survey, which are all the contiguous lode claims owned in common within the range of benefit of said improvements.

These improvements afford the most practical and economical means of developing each of the lodes and in facilitating the extraction of minerals therefrom.

Five hundred dollars or over has been expended in these improvements in such a manner as tends to the development of each lode of this survey, subsequent to its location and to the time since which common ownership and contiguity have prevailed; therefore, an undivided one-twenty seventh interest in their value is hereby credited to each of the lodes.

No portion of or interest in these improvements has been credited heretofore as patent expenditure to any lode claims.

OTHER IMPROVEMENTS

Main water storage tank. A concrete tank, 45 ft. diam. x 46 ft. high, the center of which bears S. 42°13' W., 775.22 ft. from Cor. No. 1 of the Tungsten No. 12 lode.

OTHER CORNER DESCRIPTIONS
AND SUPPLEMENTAL DATA

The corner of secs. 26, 27, 34 and 35, T. 34 N., R. 34 E., M.D.M., was found to be an iron post, 2 ins. diam., set in concrete. No brass cap was found.

Cor. No. 3 of the Tungsten No. 11 lode, identical with Cor. No. 3 of the Tungsten No. 28 lode, lies in a road and was not found.

Cor. No. 1 of the Tungsten No. 12 lode is monumented with an iron post, 2 ins. diam., 30 ins. high, surrounded by a rock mound, 3 ft. diam. x 12 ins. high, with a brass cap, 2½ ins. x 2 ins., mkd. COR NO 1-TUN NO 12-COR NO 2-TUN NO 11-SUR NO 4842.
