OTHER CORNER DESCRIPTIONS  
AND SUPPLEMENTAL DATA

The W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of sec. 4, T. 31 N., R. 44 E., Mount Diablo Mer., bears S.  $36^{\circ} 55' 31''$  W., 1,843.82 ft. dist., from Cor. No. 3 of the LIX 11 millsite monumented with a 1 in. diam. iron post, 10 ins. above the ground, surrounded by a mound of stone, with a brass cap mkd. S5  $\frac{1}{4}$  - S4 1914.

The N.  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of sec. 4, T. 31 N., R. 44 E., Mount Diablo Mer., bears N.  $74^{\circ} 35' 43''$  E., 1,220.71 ft. dist., from Cor. No. 1 of the LIX 10 millsite, monumented by a 1 in. diam. iron post, 12 ins. above the ground, surrounded by a mound of stone, with a brass cap mkd. S33  $\frac{1}{4}$  - S4 1914.

The west one-half mile on the north boundary of sec. 4, T. 31 N., R. 44 E., Mt. Diablo Meridian, was found to be S.  $81^{\circ} 30'$  W., 2,842.70 ft. dist. instead of S.  $81^{\circ} 30'$  W., 2,839.98 ft. dist. as approved.

## MEMORANDUM

The difference between the corner posts of LIX 11 millsite as found during our survey and described as shown on the location certificate is due to errors in the latter.
