

Rocky Crown same Range bears S. 81° 20' W.
Land level and gradually ascending
soil alkali, sage brush.

South on 133^d mile.

Var: 16° 30' East.

39.50 Cross Trail, Course S. E. by E.

80.00 Set Pine Post 6" x 6" square of feet long.
Deposited charred Block marked C. N.
Marked post on North side of 133 miles.
West side C. A. L.; East side N. E. V.; South
side 1872. S. 120°.

Made mound of earth 4 feet diam: 3 feet
high, with pits as per instructions.

No good objects in sight for bearings.

This post and mound is within 10 chains
of the foot of Sage Fort Mountains, Range
bears off N. W. and S. E. by E.

This mountain Range is very high and
broken.

Sage Fort Creek is about one mile East of
this point, and is a fine body of running
water.

The Land from High Rock Springs to this
place is a continuous plain of alkali and
sage brush, with but very little grass.

The Valley extends for miles East, and
finally runs into a Desert. To the West
the plain runs to Honey Lake which is
distant about 15 miles, the main body of the
Lake lying to the N. W.

I found it impossible to chain the line up the
Mountain, on line, I therefore returned to the 132^d
mile post, and set up a large flag, preparatory
to triangulating to the top of the mountain, first
having set up a flag on line top of mountain.
I ran East from the 132^d mile post a base line
