Fine view from this Peak. The Great Desert of the Amargosa Valley lays to the East and South East. To the West and South West runs a continuous Range of broken mountains forming the Eastern Boundary of Death Valley proper, it is very rugged and utterly destitute of timber grass or water. On top of Peak at point of triangulation I set up Nut Pine Post 6" 46" square 5ft long marked Post N.W. side C. 425 miles 10 chs N.E. side N.E. SW side C.A.S. and S.E. side 1873. -

Made mound of stone 4ft dia 3ft high and deposited charred Block marked C.H.

From which a Nut Pine 18" dia dist 41 links bears East, marked Tree R.T. N.E.

Sharp Peak in Plain bears S. 83° E.

Finding the Country on line still too rough for chaining, and that this Mountain Peak could be seen from the plains below, I set up large signal flag for triangulation, and proceeded to flag my line forward until I reached a favorable position to run a base line, and having found the same I
