

bluff to end of mile on south side of deep ravine. Above excavation and planted Quaker's asp post 7 feet long by 10 inches square at top: deeply marked on the north face "O" on the South "N" on the East 219M on the West 42 T. Built mound of stone and earth, of prescribed size, dug trench and pits.

Land mountainous. Soil in narrow valley first rate.

Could get no bearings - too low.

Ravine follows line to South of it.

Thence descend skirting north side of Creek 2 chains mountain Spring - 25 chains cross bluff - 35 chains cross Creek course to West - 41 chains cross Creek course to West 52 chains cross rocky bluff. Thence to end of mile. Planted stone 26 x 18 x 10 inches: deeply marked on the north face "O" on the South "N" on the East

220M 220M on the West 42 T. Built mound of earth of prescribed size, dug trench and pits. Situated on South East bench mountain below rocky ledge small Creek skirts line most of this mile a few chains South of line.

Bearings: to high peak Pueblo range  $N 64^{\circ} 10' W$  distance 12 miles, to sharp
