17.38 Cross creek 20 links wide, course northwest and ascend.

31.72 Intersect boundary line between California and Nevada at a point which bears 211.22 chains N.48°12'W. from the 326 + 69th. mile post and set a post 4½ feet long, 4 inches square with marked stone 12 inches in the ground for closing corner to Township 1 south, Ranges 32 and 33 east marked
