

Resurvey of a Portion of the West Boundary of

Fractional T. 32 S., R. 65 E.

Chains. From the cor. of secs. 25, 30, 31 and 36, on W. bdy. of Tp. South, on a random line bet. secs. 31 and 36.

39.94 A point 33 lks. E. of the original $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., which a mesquite post, 2 ins. sq., 24 ins. long, set in a mound of earth, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S on W. side.

I destroy all evidence of this cor.
Continue line and measurement bet. secs. 31 and 36.

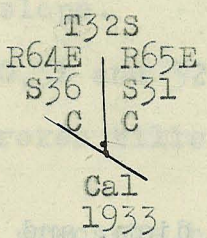
80.30 A point 84 lks. W. of the original standard cor. of Tps. 32 S., Rs. 64 and 65 E.; a granite stone 20x8x16 ins. above ground, marked with 6 notches on E. 6 notches on W. and 6 notches on N. sides.

I destroy all evidence of this cor.
Return to the cor. of secs. 25, 30, 31 and 36, on W. bdy. of Tp.

Thence
South on a true line bet. secs. 31 and 36.

Over broken hills, through scattered undergrowth.
Descend 50 ft. on SW. slope.

17.89 Intersect the California-Nevada State Boundary.
Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 4 ins. in the ground to bedrock, with a stone, mkd. X, deposited at the base, and in a mound of stone to top, for closing cor. of frac. secs. 31 and 36, with brass cap mkd.



From point of intersection monument 137 on the state boundary, bears N. 45° 38' W., 1.05 chs. dist.; described in the field notes of the Portion of the California-Nevada State Boundary resurveyed under this group.
Land, broken hills...
Soil, rocky; 4th rate.
No timber.
Undergrowth, scattered greasewood, cactus, yucca and sage.
